Parent Forum

Lucy Rycroft, one of our Parent Governors, is working hard on behalf of the School and Governors to make sure your voice is heard. Here are some answers to the questions raised at our last Parent Forum in March. Do you want to have your say? How is communication being improved in the school?

School newsletters are now distributed every two weeks (instead of every month). Text reminders are being sent to parents regularly. Please check school has an up-to-date phone number to ensure you receive these. Please join our new Facebook page for all the latest news and updates ('Haxby Road Primary Academy'). We are hoping to eventually produce 'Audio News', a sound file of the fortnightly newsletters, which will help us to access news on the go, as well as get the news if a paper newsletter has been lost.

Can halal meat be provided in the school canteen?

Yes. From now on there will be a halal option for chicken, sausages and burgers.

Can sandwiches be provided as a dinner option?

The school is considering whether this is possible and/or advisable. We are trialling sandwich wraps on our menu in the Summer Term.

Is my child allowed time off for religious festivals?

Yes. Please apply in writing to Ms Lightfoot for time off for 'religious observance'.

Is the policy on parents taking photos/videos of school events too lenient? We're concerned about images of our children appearing on other parents' Facebook feeds.

Ms Lightfoot is going to consult Local Authority guidance for advice on our policy. We would also like your views, please could you complete the slip below and return to school.

We're trying to be punctual for school - but it doesn't help when the doors open late, or when children are let out late in the afternoon.

Apologies for this - all the clocks in school were set at slightly different times. They have been adjusted, and hopefully you're now noticing an improvement.

Is 'Star of the Week' given out equally?

All staff keep a record of who has received star of the week to ensure equality, however, to be worthwhile this award needs to be earned. Some children will get it twice (because there are more weeks in the year than there are pupils in each class), and it will always be given on merit. Each child is given opportunities to shine and gain this award, but it can't be given if a child is persistently refusing to follow school rules.
